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

Unicef GIACOMO PIROZZI THE RIGHTS OF CHILDREN

The new exhibition The Rights of Children, inspired by the book bearing the same title, is the detailed testimony of photographer Giacomo Pirozzi on the condition of children and the work of UNICEF in developing nations. The book narrates the rights of children through photographs taken by the author during his 19 years of work around the world. Exquisite images that are fragments of lives lived on the edge, of denied and exploited childhoods, but that also allow for a glimmer of hope, because they show that it is possible to realize children's rights by carrying out programs for their education, protection, health. The goal is to celebrate The Convention on the Rights of the Child on its twentieth anniversary (1989 - 2009) and to strengthen the awareness of UNICEF's work on the field.

ABRUZZO: STORIES OF GOLD AND MUD, APRIL 2009

One year after the earthquake that devastated the Italian town of L'Aquila, the collective exhibition *Stories of Gold and Mud* aims to retrace the large and small wounds left hidden on the streets, in the homes, and on the faces of those that, since April 6 2009, have lost everything. In the images of the three freelance reporters one can feel the weight of the event that hit the heart of Italy: an event which caused so much suffering but which also brought out the courage, solidarity and vitality of a community that surprised everyone with its strength. To reflect and to act, not only to remember. Alessandro (25 years old, from Sicily), Valeria (24 years old, from Sardinia) and Ali (25 years old, from the UAE) were festival volunteers in 2009.

ITALIAN SENATE LIBRARY FRONT PAGE MOON

The exhibition Front Page Moon of the Italian Senate Library Emeroteca was created to narrate the transformation of the Italian press on the occasion of an epic event, the moon landing in 1969. The exhibition is made up of a series of panels that reproduce about 100 pages of newspapers of that era, selected among the most representative of the time with the intention of showing the graphical and conceptual evolution of the press which then followed. The pages, taken from dailies and periodicals, retrace the events, illustrate the scientific data, present the protagonists through an articulated iconographic structure, the revolutionary use of the print characters, the prevalence of colour, the inspired comments of the paper editors and of the great intellectuals of that time.



GAETANO PORCASI FACES, COLOURS, MEMORIES

The paintings of Gaetano Porcasi are not only painted news, as they have been hastily defined, but they are news that become history, they are a reinterpretation of the facts in a dimension in which the images are coloured in myth, but still reproduce the cruelty of the events in their own contexts. His path, which began many years ago, pauses upon the mafia universe and especially the moments in which the atrocity of the murderers clashed against the repressive actions of the State, or colluded with them. Porcasi is able to go far beyond the factual, reproducing faces, objects, the flora, the traditions, the work, the colours and the symbols of Sicilian reality. Many of Porcasi's paintings were purchased by the town of Corleone in Sicily and will decorate the walls of the forthcoming museum of the fight against mafia, in the former house of captured mafia boss Bernardo Provenzano.
